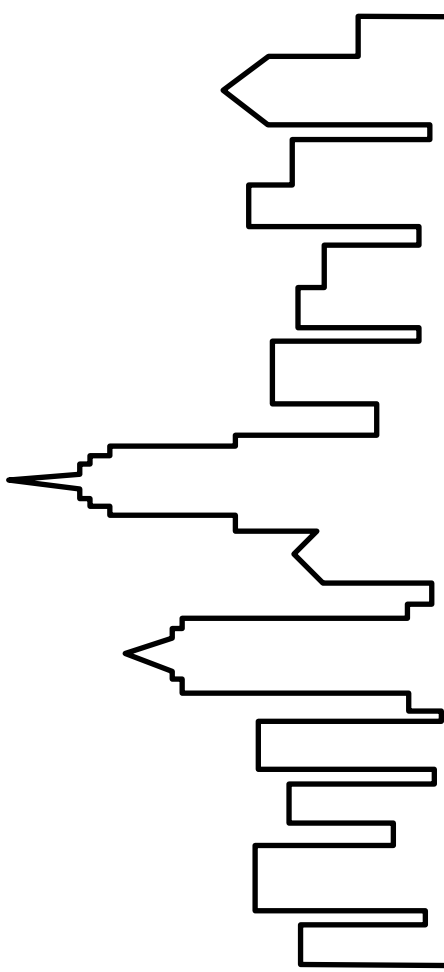

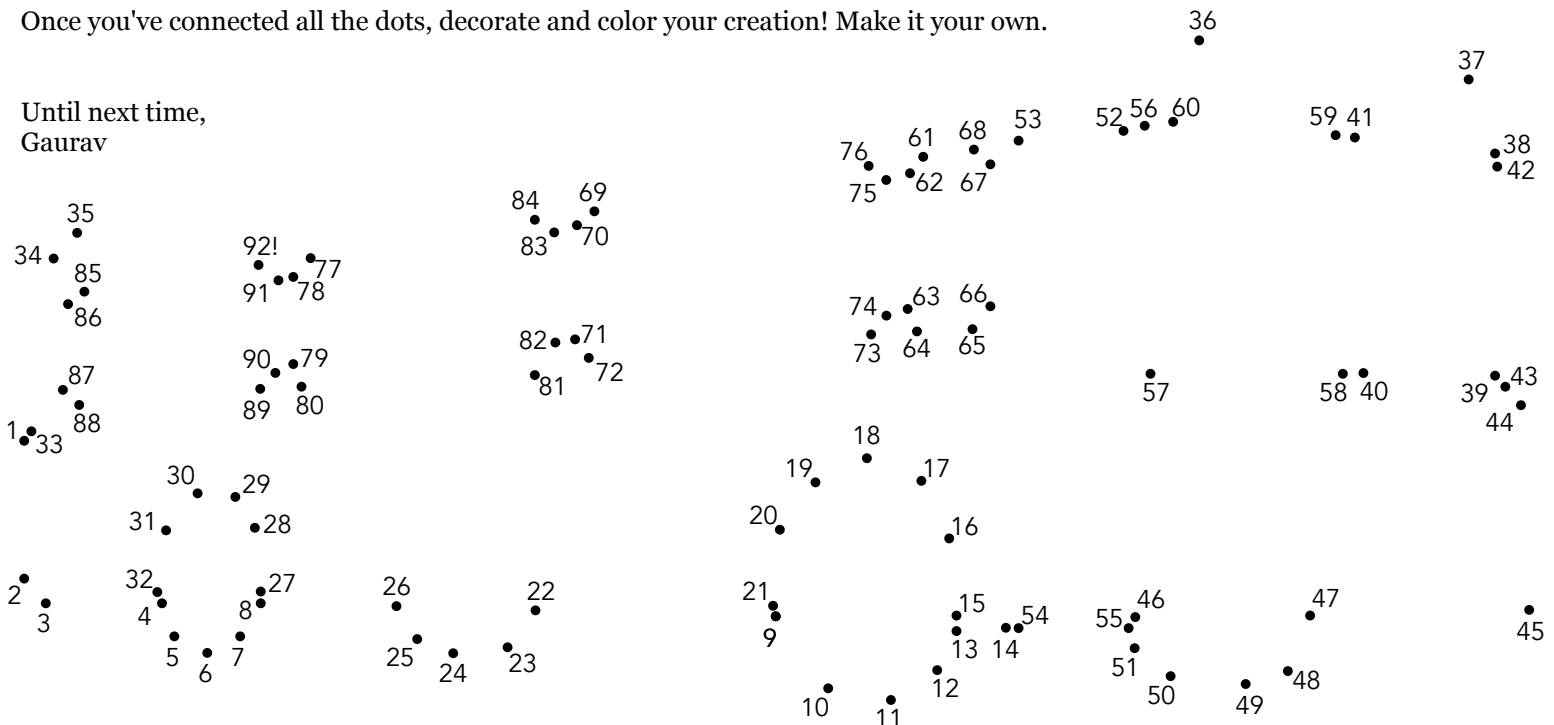
Concluding Connect The Dots

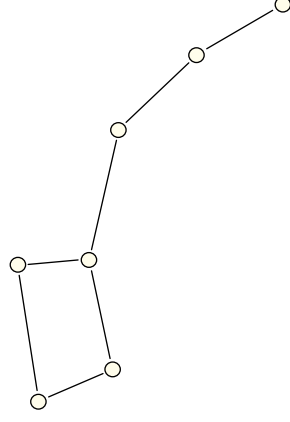
